The life you live in front of the world may determine the eternal destiny of others. The encouragement of the series of sermons I am completing this week – "Cracks in the Armor; Imperfect Soldiers of the Cross" is that it is never too late to begin doing the right thing. God can and does hit a straight lick with a crooked stick. How encouraging to all of us.

The danger of the series I am completing this week is that you slack off in your pursuit of becoming like Jesus and living a holy life. Some things are right and some things are sinful according to God's definition. They always have been and they always will be. God can and does bring good out of bad, but God does not wink at evil. When we break the commandments of God we pay a price and so do others.

All Christians must be good examples in all situations. The world will never come to Christ until they see the difference He makes in our actions and reactions as we live our lives in front of them. We are being watched at all times by God- who knows our hearts, and by unsaved people – who only see our actions and hear our words.
